## **Farewell of Jazz Williams**

Our community was shocked to hear the news of our dear friend Jazz Williams (a past student of our kura) pass away suddenly on Sunday the 24th of July. Jazz attended Koromatua school from 2013-2020. He graduated as a Year 8 and went on to attend Melville High School. He was in Yr 10 this year. Jazz was a very popular classmate. His gentle ways and witty sense of humour drew many people to him, adults and children alike. He was an awesome chess player and loved to play video games. Despite Jazz's muscular disease it didn't stop him from trying new things. He especially loved attending camps at Ngaruawahia and Raglan. Jazz's older sister Lyric attended Koromatua, as well as Jazz's aunties and uncles. His younger sister Harmony attends our kura and is in Room 1 with Matua Freddy. Jazz's Yr 8 teacher was Matua Freddy.

On Thursday, Matua Tahi took his class and some of our kaiako to visit Jazz where he lay at his grandparents home. We sang, laughed and talked about our special memories of Jazz. It was lovely to spend time with Jazz's dad, his sisters, his grandparents and his aunties and uncles. I know that our tamariki and kaiako who attended will hold that memory in their hearts for a long time

On Friday, Matua Freddy and his class attended Jazz's funeral service and it was wonderful to see so many of our past Koromatua students coming to pay their respects to their dear friend and peer. As Jazz was farewelled, one of our past students, Israel Smith (a Yr 12 leader at Fraser High School) led the haka 'Tika Tonu' with Jazz's friends following. It was an emotional moment and the sound of the haka could be heard within the distance.
