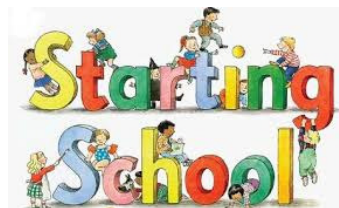


ENROLMENTS FOR TERM 1

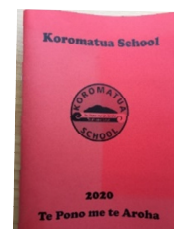
